





# A Royal Visit

## Adult Guidance

Please find below the reading comprehension questions and some handy talking points for your class after the children have read the minibook. These are designed to be adult-led and encourage discussion either one-to-one, in a small group or with the whole class.

### 1. What did Kit and Sam enjoy?

**Answer:** Playing with the royal toys.

#### Follow-up questions:

- Children might say they enjoyed the trip to the palace or seeing the royal children. Look together at page 2. Talk about the word 'joy' meaning they enjoyed it as a specific example.
- What kind of toys do you think would be in a palace?
- If the royal children came to your house, which of your toys would you like to show them?

### 2. Kit and Sam did not like getting lost. Can you explain this?

**Answers might include:** Getting lost is scary. They didn't know where they were.

#### Discussion points:

- Have you ever got lost?
- How does being lost make you feel?
- What do you think you should do if you get lost?

### 3. The text says 'The royal children went to see the din.' What is a din?

**A:** A big mess     **B:** A big noise     **C:** The dog's dinner

#### Discussion point:

- What is a 'din'? Can you think of any other words to describe a loud noise?
