Adult Guidance

Please find below the reading comprehension questions and some handy talking points for your class after the children have read the minibook. These are designed to be adult-led and encourage discussion either one-to-one, in a small group or with the whole class.

1. Why did Sam fall out of the tree?

Answer: She was shocked by a wren.

Follow-up questions:

- · What is a wren?
- · Where were Kit and Sam going when they saw the kite?
- · How do you think the kite ended up in the tree?

2. What is the adverb in the sentence, 'Kit bravely got the kite out of the tree'?

Answer: bravely

Follow-up questions:

- Can you think of a different adverb that could have been used in the sentence?
- · What is the verb in the sentence?
- Why do you think Kit was described as being brave?

3. Where did the note, attached to the Kite, ask for it to be sent?

Answer: A: Mum's shop

Follow-up questions:

- · Why was an address written on the kite?
- · Why might the child have given her mum's work address instead of her home address on the note?
- How many 'wr' words can you find in the note?

4. Why didn't Sam want the doctor to cut her kite-sling off?

Answers might include: She wanted to return the kite to its owner. She didn't want the kite to break/be cut up.

Follow-up questions:

- · Why do you think the doctor wanted to cut the kite off?
- · What did the doctor put on Sam's arm instead of the kite?
- · What is a sling and what does it do?

5. Would you return a lost kite to its owner? Why or why not?

Answers might include: Any reasonable answer relating to why they would or wouldn't return a lost kite.

Discussion points:

- · How would you feel if you lost something important to you?
- · How would you feel if somebody returned it to you?
- Do you think Kit and Sam did the right thing returning the kite?

6. Can you think of three adjectives to describe Kit and Sam's kite?

Answers might include: colourful, beautiful, bright, stripy, long, bendy, light.

Discussion points:

- · How do you think Kit and Sam felt when their kite won in the competition?
- · What do you think the little girl might have said to Kit and Sam when she met them?
- · Can you describe what happened in the story to a partner?
