Fluff's Animal Rescue






A 'Let's Read Together!' Book

There was lots of information in the reception area. Mel introduced herself and she showed us the dog kennels and the groom room.




In the groom room, the dogs were getting a bath and causing a commotion. The children entered a competition to name the dog that had just arrived.
